OUR SHIP - HMNZS TE KAHA

Did you know that Bailey Road School has historical ties to the naval ship - HMNZS Te Kaha? Throughout this term we will share further information about our connection. This is why we have the anchor by our flagpole. Below is a message from Greg Staines in the Royal NZ Navy, currently onboard Te Kaha.





A very happy new year to all the staff and pupils of Bailey Road School. I just wanted to drop you an email message to say that HMNZS Te Kaha sailed yesterday from Devonport Naval Base for the Middle East region. I regret we were unable to bring some of sailors to Bailey Road School prior to our departure, but our pre deployment training requirements following this year's extended Xmas leave period were substantial. We simply ran out of time.

Te Kaha's crew of 179 crew and our embarked Seasprite helicopter will be deployed for six months supporting Combined Task Force 150 (CTF150) maritime actions outside the Arabian Gulf, and conducting other operations involving our military partners. CTF150 is a multinational task force that conducts maritime security operations in the region and is dedicated to preventing the illegal transfer of people, narcotics and weaponry. The profits from these shipments are a known source of funding for criminal and terrorist networks. Our area of operations is immense. It spans more than five million square kilometres across the Red Sea, Gulf of Aden, Gulf of Oman, Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean. To ensure maximum coverage, ships from partner navies will patrol alongside HMNZS Te Kaha.

At this time we cannot divulge our ports of call or any dates, but we will endeavour to make contact regularly to tell our story with the staff and pupils of Bailey Road School. Please find attached a photo of HMNZS Te Kaha entering Sydney Harbour in Dec last year. I wish you, staff and pupils a successful 2025.

Halal credentials

While information is available on the portal, we have received some enquiries around the halal credentials of our meals so wanted to provide clarity. At the School Lunch Collective, we strive to accommodate as many dietary preferences as possible. Our 'Halal Friendly' meals are made with Halal suitable ingredients, and they do not contain pork or pork containing ingredients. Our team are very well trained, and we have very strict cleaning and wash down procedures between each meal production. However, the way the meals are handled and prepared in our production facility is not strictly Halal, so our production facility is not Halal Certified. Therefore, we class our meals as 'Halal Friendly'. We recommend individuals with halal requirements exercise personal discretion and assess their comfort levels before consuming our meals"

A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Nau mai, Haere Mai.

We say goodbye to our large, senior, adventure playground. The playground has served us well for many years but is now ready to go to the great playground resting place in the sky. Students are aware they cannot use it any longer and its removal is currently taking place. Replacement proposals are being considered by the Board of Trustees.

In the next few weeks, artificial turf will be laid in the senior quad area, providing a modern, attractive surface for our senior students to enjoy. The installation process should take about two weeks.

In line with Ministry of Education directives to increase our efforts to bring about better attendance rates and reduce lateness to school, we have introduced our 80/20 plan from Year 4 and up. To be eligible to represent the school in sporting events or perform for cultural events like assembly dances or Kapa Haka, students have to be achieving an 80% or better attendance rate and a lower than 20% lateness rate. Students are informed weekly of their attendance and lateness rates, and are aware that they can quickly bring about change.

Dogs in our school have been discussed by the Board of Trustees at our last meeting. Currently dogs are not allowed onsite except at the principal's discretion. Two staff member dogs do have permission to be onsite and those dogs are used to engage students and, sometimes, calm ākonga who may be out of sorts. The Board is looking to modify our policy to allow dogs owned by community members onsite, again at the Principal's discretion, as long as the following guidelines are adhered to:

The dog is on a leash held by an adult; the leash is short; if the dog is a breed considered by the council to need muzzling, that it is muzzled; visiting dogs must not enter school buildings; the dog owner should inform any interested children of the best way to approach their dog; dogs may not drink from school water fountains; owners must remove any mess left by dogs; only council registered dogs; only dogs with up to date vaccination are allowed on school grounds.


