

We thank Greg for taking the time to listen, ask questions and understand our concerns. Greg will take our concerns back to Parliament.

What does an RTLit do?

They provide expertise to teachers and intervention teachers on how to improve their literacy teaching practice, and how to make assessments of a student's learning, in line with the curriculum.

Our large adventure playground has been removed and the ground levelled. This week, topsoil was delivered and we will be returning the space to grass for the time being.




