Special Diet Information For Parents & Caregivers 6

Overview

Here at Alliance catering, we understand how important it is to support students with special dietary needs. That's why we lead the way utilising our in-house registered dietitian and specialised allergy diet chef to ensure students needs are met to the best of our ability.

The following newsletter outlines our special diets framework, detailing what we offer, and the process involved in applying for the correct diet. Please note, this framework exists to cater for students with a medical need for an alternative diet (e.g. an allergy) or for students with cultural dietary needs. The framework does not cater for non-medical or non-cultural dietary requests, such as likes, dislikes and taste preferences.

Please complete the flow chart on the final page if you need help understanding which diet is suitable for your child.

Regular Meals:

Main meal

Main meal – vegetarian

These meals should be ordered for all student unless they have a medical or cultural grounds to request an alternative diet. All meals are prepared without nuts and seafood. Students with nut and seafood aversions should select either of the regular meal options. Please note *Ingredients that state "may contain traces of nuts or/seafood"* may be used when a suitable alternative cannot be found.

Special Meals:

Alliance provides the following special diet to students with specific medical or cultural dietary needs, without requiring medical verification:

Vegan Friendly

No Ingredients Containing Egg *

No Ingredients Containing Dairy *

No Ingredients Containing Gluten *

No Ingredients Containing Gluten* & Vegan Friendly

Due to the complexity of arranging such meals, you will not be able to order these meals due to preference, and/or when a given meal offering is preferred.

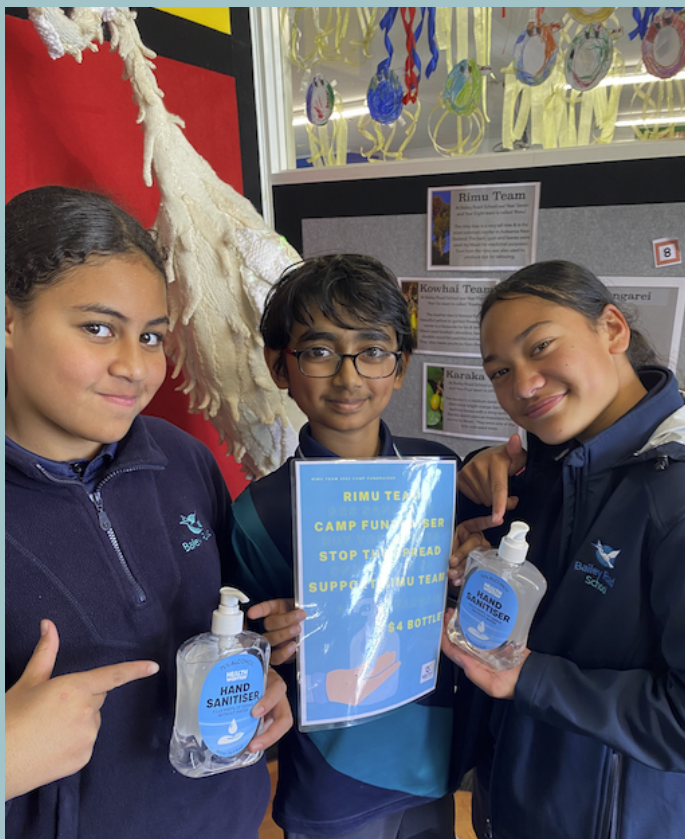

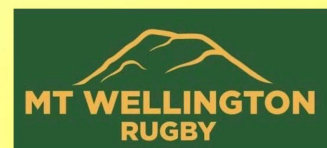
