TIRONUI TRUST MUSIC



BRS IS A KidsCan SCHOOL

A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL - MR KELLY

Tēnā koutou

Winter is upon us. We have noticed a drop in attendance in the third week of term two. The weather will get wetter and colder going forward and there will be more sniffles and coughs as a result. To combat this, on cold and wet days we make sure your tamariki are inside, dry and warm. We do not have outside play when it rains and do our best to have students in warm, dry surroundings to maximise their learning.

It was great to see so many of you attend our parent/teacher conferences last week. It is always a highlight of the year for teachers to meet with whānau, set goals, and discuss the progress their children are making. Any appointments that were postponed, Mrs Love on jury service, for example, will be rescheduled as these meetings are vital to align home and school in our shared goals for the best outcomes we can achieve together for our ākonga.

Last week we celebrated Support Staff Day. On this day we acknowledge the work of all of our non-registered teaching staff. These include our caretakers, office staff, and learning support staff. A school would not be able to run without these dedicated workers and we are very lucky to have a great team of them.

One of the particular differences I noticed in Finland was the abundance of in-class support workers. The Finnish system puts a lot of financial resources into making sure that there is more than one adult in all junior classrooms so that effective coverage of the youngest students can be assured. Our education system is not as well resourced as Finland's. The most recent figures available from 2019 show that Finland spent US\$12,000 per student, while New Zealand spent US\$8,600. Finland and New Zealand have almost exactly the same population.

Saying this, our education system is high functioning and well respected as an education leader in certain areas. I often wonder what we would be able to achieve, given our existing skills, when provided with additional resources?

We have enjoyed a large number of new entrants entering our school in 2024, and long may it continue. We will be opening a new, new entrant class, near the end of this term. Our Board of Trustees and staff thank you for your efforts. In the end a school is only as good as its community, and we realise we are very lucky to

be able to work with you to bring about the best results for our young people.





